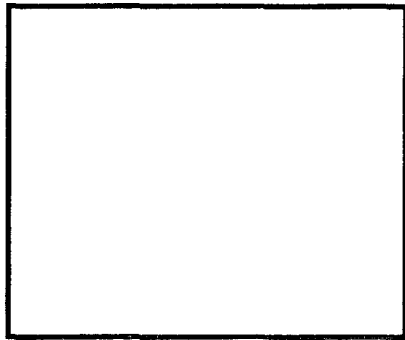
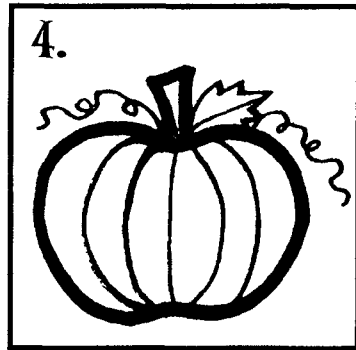
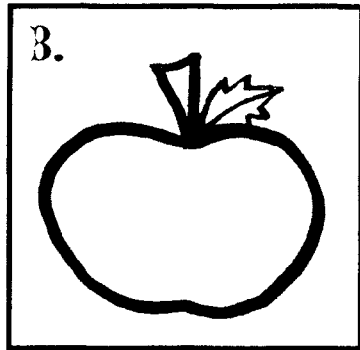
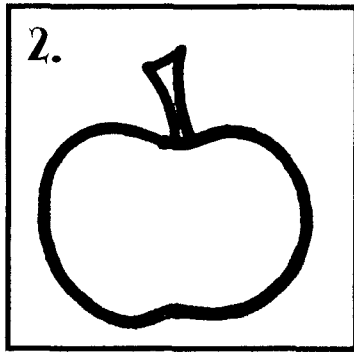
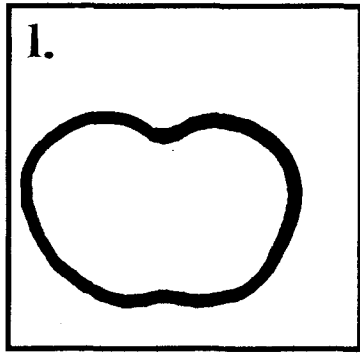


Follow the steps and draw your own pumpkin
